# History shows up on our Facebook page

Recently the church received a message on our Facebook page from a gentleman in Michigan and with his permission I would like to share this bit of church history with you. The story begins with finding one of our church bulletins from 1915.

"I apologize about the lengthy message I'm about to send, but this is the story about how my father, who lives in Wisconsin, came into possession of this German Bible dated 1901. My father came into possession of this Bible, I'm guessing 40+/-years ago. He had a friend who had a box of books that were old

that he was just going to throw away. My dad didn't want that to happen so he grabbed them and took them home. I believe nearly all were written in different languages, German and Swedish mostly. Not knowing either language, they sat down in the basement all this time. My dad has been going through the house, getting rid of things he didn't need, and had these books sitting in the box. Since I was visiting, I thought I would grab a book out at random and just try to figure out what he had. First I grabbed one of the Swedish books, and I believe it was an old devotional book. Long story there, but my 13 year old boy is really interested in things like

different languages and cultures, and he's the one who determined it was Swedish, based on the alphabet. So we did some more digging trying to figure out what each book was, when towards the bottom of the box we came across the Bible. I felt it was pretty obvious that it was a Bible just based on size and shape, plus the cross on the cover is a give away. So we opened it up and saw that this one was in German and came across the bulletin inside of it. We paged through it and came to the names at the back. My dad suggested it would be neat to find

Upon finding your page, I noticed that your address was High St and my dad and I both were excited that after all these years, the church is still there. That is when I reached out to you."

I researched the dates and family names Andrew sent and discovered this family was once well established here. The father was a language teacher at what is now Truman State. Several of his descendants were baptized in our church. With the help of a friend I actually located family still living in the area. However, that is where the story stops for now. I am praying Andrew, his father and his son were able to contact the family and will let us know the Bible has found its way home.
