Let's Connect This Summer!

Fellowship is one of the primary purposes of the church, and we've been staying connected as best we can during a pandemic. It's been a challenge for all of us, so we're continuing to work on new ways to connect with one another. We want everyone to feel supported by our church community!

Here are five ways we can connect beginning in May:

Livestreamed Sunday Morning Services

This will continue to be our primary way of gathering on Sunday mornings; it's the safest option, and protecting all of our members is our priority! Tune in on Facebook at 9:30 a.m. on Sunday mornings on the First Presbyterian Facebook page, every Sunday except the fourth Sunday of the month (which will be outdoors; see number 2 below!). The comments section is always active throughout the service, which helps us maintain connections with one another even when we can't physically be together. And our new technology committee is working to make our livestream experience even better!

Outdoor Sunday Morning Services

Our services on the fourth Sunday of each month will be held outdoors! We'll meet at Rotary Park; the service will be held in the amphitheater to give us some shade and protection for sound equipment. We will continue to mask and distance at these services, regardless of the county mask mandate expiring. Children can play at the playground during service as well! May 23rd, June 27th, and July 25th will be outdoors at Rotary Park. Our outdoor service in August will actually be the 5th Sunday (August 29th) at the Point at Thousand Hills, for our annual lakeside service.

Limited In-Person Seating in the Sanctuary

For those who are unable to participate in the livestream during our online services, we are making limited in-person seating available as safely as possible. It will not

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look or feel like pre-pandemic "normal", but hopefully will meet the needs of those for whom online services are not practicable. The first Sunday in which limited in-person seating will be available is **May 2nd**.

For the safety of all attendees, the following measures have been adopted for in-person attendance in the sanctuary:



Masks are required upon entering the building and at all times while within the building, for everyone ages and up. This applies regardless of the county mask mandate expiring.

Anyone wishing to attend in-person on a given Sunday must *pre-register for the service that Sunday*. This may be done by calling Becky at the church office or by using the Google form on the church website.

Every other pew has been roped off. Open pews may be occupied by either one family of 3+ people or by two families of 1-2 people each, on opposite ends of the pew. A *seating chart will be drawn up* based on pre-registration, and greeters will show attendees to their seats.

Attendees may enter the church up to 15 minutes prior to service beginning, and are expected to exit the building as soon as the service concludes.

We recommend that anyone considering in-person attendance be fully vaccinated.

If you attend in person, the procedure will be as follows:

Enter via the west door. No greeter will be inside these doors. Proceed upstairs to the sanctuary.

A greeter will show you to your assigned seat, where there will be a bulletin for the service.

All attendees will remain in their seats, with masks on at all times, for the duration of the service. There will be no Passing of the Peace or other greeting time.

Attendees will be *dismissed by row* at the conclusion of the service, and are expected to exit the building immediately. The pastor or speaker that day will not be at the back greeting attendees.

If you choose to visit with other attendees *outside the building* after service, *please continue masking and distancing*.

4) Outdoor Movie Nights!

The first Saturday of the month will be church-wide movie nights! Everyone is invited; while the movies will be child friendly, this is not just for kids! We will project movies on the side

of Westminster House, and everyone can bring their own blankets or chairs and snacks and drinks. We'll all make sure our blankets/chairs are 6 feet from other families, and mask when not eating or drinking (and eating and drinking only on your blanket/chair). Movie nights will be Saturday, May 1st, June 5th, July 3rd, and August 7th.

5) Book Club

The **second week of the month** is for adult book club! We'll choose a different book to read each month, and then *meet once a month* to discuss it. Our first meeting will be via **Zoom on Sunday, May 9th at 1:00 p.m.**During this meeting we'll decide on a recurring meeting time, day of the week, and location

(Zoom or somewhere outdoors) that will work for those who are interested. Because it will be a different book each month, and we're just meeting monthly, you can choose to attend all book club meetings or just a few; whatever works with your schedule.
