






Notes from Session

- The Deacons met, talking about the Fall Festival on October 23 (11:00-1:00 p.m.), and our church's contribution. Thanks to the Deacons for coordinating the day.
- We have chosen a musical "Waiting for Jesus" for the White Gift Service on December 11. Because it is in the middle of Advent, the topic seems very appropriate.
- Curriculum has been chosen for advent, including the "Illustrated Ministry" curriculum for the children's class and "Advent in Narnia" for the youth.
- Stewardship season will be starting soon—watch for announcements in church!
- House and Grounds has been working to fix our refrigerator, that's been running too warm, and our van's catalytic converter has also been replaced.
- From Worship and Sacraments, All Saint's Day will feature white carnations in the back of the church for all to take and place at the front of the church. Also, a decision was made to discontinue Children's Time for the rest of this calendar year.
- The church service time survey indicated a majority who preferred the current service time of 9:30 a.m. We'll continue the conversation about ways to make the church more welcoming in a town hall on January 8—watch for more information as the date gets closer.
- The Session discussed use of the church building by Prairie Song Academy, and
 passed a motion to clarify building use rules for the school. Prairie Song is thankful
 for the clarification and asks that any issues be brought to their attention as soon
 as possible, so that any conflicts can be resolved quickly.



The Clothes Closet started the month of October off with our sixth annual trip to Community Connect where we gave away socks. We made some good connections with other organizations in our community and came home with coats donated by the Moose Lodge!

Laundry Day went very well with 9 families signing in for laundry assistance. We are still looking for volunteers to help Saturday, November 19 from 1:00-3:00 at Scrubby Duds.

Our Blanket Saturday went very well again this year and we gave blankets to 33 families. We welcomed some new volunteers. Thank you Kate, Mason, Maya, Teresa and Kenton for manning the blanket tables at the church so Brenda, Lynn and Pam could welcome 36 families at the Clothes Closet. It was a very busy morning!

The community Take One/Leave One coat rack is back at Community Mission. A big thank you to Deb and Ron Fischer and their church family for collecting coats to help keep it stocked through the winter.

November will be a month of recovery as we greeted over 260 families to the Clothes Closet in October (an estimated 1020 individuals came looking for clothing). We are in desperate need of men's clothing this winter. We have already gone through most of what we have received and winter hasn't even begun.

Christmas is around the corner and plans have begun for this year's Christmas Shoppe to be held Saturday, December 17. Volunteers will be needed for this event as well, so mark you calendar now to save us a space.

PERRY G. EASLEY MEMORIAL (1936-2022)

The Perry G. Easley Memorial was dedicated on October 23, 2022, during the church morning worship service. Perry was born on December 16, 1936, in Novelty, MO, and graduated from the Novelty School District in 1954. At the age of 12, his father put him on a tractor and for the next 40 years he farmed the family farm. He served in the United States Army Reserves from 1959 to 1965. In 1991 he owned the Osage Orange Woodworking and Welding Company in Kirksville. His talent was well known in several states for his artistic name logs. He was a member of Post #29, American Legion in Anchorage, AK and a member of First Presbyterian Church of Kirksville. Perry always helped the church with many projects behind the scenes. He was united in marriage to Laura Scobee in 1963 and they were the parents of two sons, Mark (Kim) Easley of Liberty, MO and Matthew (Kimberly) of Troy, MO and four grandchildren. He passed away on September 6, 2020.

The two north church entrance lanterns and the two east building exterior lights were in bad repair and needed to be replaced. The Perry Easley Memorial has made it possible to replace all four lights with new dusk to dawn illumination. These dark areas are now brightly lit for building and public security.

We honor this wonderful gift to the church in Perry's memory with reverence and gratitude. We thank our Lord for his life and
